Thanks to all who are or who will help us provide hats & scarfs for our participation in the US Friends of AMAR project. We received a visit from a very special guest, **Baroness Emma**, this last Friday. She has been working for over 30 years to alleviate suffering for men, women and children in war torn regions around the world. Her latest efforts have been focused on helping those fleeing from Ukraine during this war. She told us there are 50,000 registered orphaned and refugee children now living in Romania. It gets cold during the winter so they are asking for 5,000 hats to help where they can. Lifting Hands International have given us over 2,000 hats plus the ones our Friends of AMARalready already have. They need more scarves to go with the hats plus more hats to fulfill their goal of 5,000.


What we are asking for:

- *We need help making handmade crocheted or knitted hats and scarfs (double stranded, see instructions below).
- *We need fleece to be cut into scarfs to go with the many hats already created.
- *We need small notes of encouragement (will be sent inside each hat and scarf bundle).
- *Come to help us at our Service Center Louise Brown, who is running this project for the Baroness, needs help putting these all together to prepare them for shipping. She will be sending SHW some bags of hats for us to help with this process.

Hats & Scarf Patterns, Tips and Tricks



If you are working with regular worsted-weight yarn, use 2 strands like in the photo. It is fun if you want to mix two different colors, but you can stick with one color for both strands for a solid look. If you're using chunky yarn, one strand should do the trick!
